- 1) **H.Res. 185** - Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding the creation of refugee populations in the Middle East, North Africa, and the Persian Gulf region as a result of human rights violations  
(Sponsored by Rep. Nadler / Foreign Affairs Committee)
- 2) **H.Res. 997** - Expressing the strong support of the House of Representatives for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization to enter into a Membership Action Plan with Georgia and Ukraine (Sponsored by Rep. Wexler / Foreign Affairs Committee)
- 3) **H.Con.Res. 154** - Expressing the sense of Congress that the fatal radiation poisoning of Russian dissident and writer Alexander Litvinenko raises significant concerns about the potential involvement of elements of the Russian Government in Mr. Litvinenko's death and about the security and proliferation of radioactive materials (Sponsored by Rep. Ros-Lehtinen / Foreign Affairs Committee)
